1	333	H.Amdt.278 to H.R.2609 (Heck) offered 7/9/2013. Increases funding for the Weapons Activities account by \$14 million and to reduce funding for the Defense Nuclear Nonproliferation account by \$16.546 million. Failed 86 – 338. Council position: oppose
2	334	H.Amdt.279 to H.R.2609 (Polis) offered 7/9/2013. Reduces funding for SLBMs by \$13.072 million and to apply the savings to the spending reduction account. Failed 182 – 243. Council position: support
3	332	H.Amdt.277 to H.R.2609 (Quigley and Polis) offered 7/10/13. Eliminates a funding increase for the B61 Life Extension Program. Failed 196-227. Council position: support

4	222	H.Amdt.142 to H.R. 1960 (Blumenauer) offered 6/13/2013. Reduces the statutory requirement for the number of operational carriers that the U.S. Navy must have from 11 to 10. Failed: 106-318. Council position: support
5	232	H.Amdt.159 to H.R. 1960 (Nolan) offered 6/13/2013. Reduces total funds authorized in this Act by \$60 Billion. This would have brought the spending level in the bill to be approximately in line with the level mandated in existing law. Failed 71-353. Council position: support
6	233	H.Amdt.161 to H.R.1960 (Larsen) offered 6/13/13. Reinstates funding to comply with the New START Treaty that the Committee cut. Failed 195-229. Council position: support
7	226	H.Amdt.149 to H.R.1960 (McGovern, Jones, Smith, Lee, Garamendi) offered 6/13/2013. Supports the ending of the war as quickly as possible and expresses the sense of Congress that any deployment post-2014 of U.S. forces require new, explicit Congressional authorization. Agreed to 305-121. Council position: support
8	229	H.Amdt.155 to H.R.1960 (Turner) offered 6/13/2013. Requires the President to convey to Congress the details of any proposed deals with the Russian Federation concerning the missile defense or nuclear arms of the United States. Agreed to 239-182.

9	381	H.Amdt.356 to H.R. 2397 (Polis) offered 7/23/2013. Strikes \$107 million for 14 Ground-based Interceptors and reduces the deficit by the same amount. Failed 141-272 . Council position: support
10	384	H.Amdt.362 to H.R. 2397 (Nadler) offered 7/23/2013. Cuts \$70 million of unrequested funds for the East Coast Missile Defense site and dedicates that funding to deficit reduction instead. Failed 173-249 . Council position: support
11	397	H.Amdt.384 to H.R. 2397 (Quigley) offered 7/23/2013. Limits funds made available in the bill to operate and maintain no more than 300 land-based intercontinental ballistic missiles. Failed 142-283 . Council position: support
12	403	H.Amdt.392 to H.R. 2397 (Mulvaney) offered 7/23/2013. Reduces funds made available in the Overseas Contingency Operations budget by \$3,546,000,000 to better correspond with the President's request. Agreed to 215-206 . Council position: support
13	410	H.Amdt.407 to H.R.2397 (Schiff) offered 7/24/13. Prohibits funding the use of force pursuant to the Authorization for Use of Military Force (AUMF, PL 107-40) effective on December 31, 2014 - concurrent with the end of our combat role in Afghanistan. Failed 185-236 . Council position: support
Doggett-Price Pro-Iran Diplomacy Letter (February 2014)		
14	NOT A VOTE	A letter organized by Lloyd Dogget (D-Texas) and David Price (D-N.C.) and signed by 98 voting members of Congress supporting a diplomatic deal with Iran over its nuclear program. Council position: support. Representatives who signed the letter are scored "+." Reps. That did not sign the letter are scored "-."

15	NOT A VOTE	<p>A letter organized by Representatives Mulvaney (R-S.C.) and Van Hollen (D-Md.) and signed by 20 representatives to President Obama raising concerns about the use of Overseas Contingency Operations account to circumvent the budget caps. Sent May 22, 2014.</p> <p>Council position: support. Representatives who signed the letter are scored “+.” Reps. who did not signed are given “N/A” and the letter does not count towards their total score.</p>

16	226	<p>H.Amdt.666 to H.R.4435 (Sanchez) offered 5/20/2014. Seeks to give DOD authority to transfer funds to nuclear nonproliferation and not just to weapons activities and naval reactors as was allowed for in the bill. Failed 194-227.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>
17	227	<p>H.Amdt. 669 to H.R. 4435 (Daines) offered 5/20/2014. Strikes language in the bill, which terminates in 2021 the requirement that ICBM silos remain in at least warm status. Agreed to 222-196</p> <p>Council position: oppose</p>
18	238	<p>H.Amdt.681 to H.R.4435 (Blumenauer) offered 5/21/2014. Requires CBO to update, on an annual basis, their report on the projected costs of U.S. nuclear forces. Agreed to 224-199.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>
19	236	<p>H.Amdt.679 to H.R.4435 (Lamborn) offered 5/21/2014. Limits the use of funds for implementing the New START treaty until certification is in place that the Russian Federation is respecting Ukrainian sovereignty and is no longer violating the INF or CFE treaties. Agreed to 233-191.</p> <p>Council position: oppose</p>
20	237	<p>H.Amdt.680 to H.R.4435 (Schiff) offered 5/21/2014. Sunsets the 2001 Authorization to use Military Force (AUMF) effective 12 months from date of enactment of the bill. Failed 191 to 233.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>

21	320	<p>H.Amdt.896 to H.R.4870 (Nadler) offered 6/18/2014. Seeks to strike Section 8132 of the bill which relates to a prohibition on use of funds with respect to any non-deployed status of Minuteman III ballistic missiles. Failed 187-233.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>
22	319	<p>H.Amdt.885 to H.R.4870 (Blumenauer) offered 6/18/2014. Increases funding for Environmental Restoration, Formerly Used Defense Sites, by \$3.4 million and to reduce funds by the same amount for a program that provides the Air Force with a Long Range Standoff Weapon. Failed 179-242.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>
23	326	<p>H.Amdt.912 to H.R.4870 (Lee) offered 6/19/201. Adds the following language to the end of the bill: "None of the funds made available by this Act may be obligated or expended pursuant to the Authorization for Use of Military Force Against Iraq Resolution of 2002." Failed 182-231.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>

24	384	<p>H.Amdt.1005 to H.R.4923 (Quigley) offered 7/9/2014. Reduces funds for the National Nuclear Security Administration Weapons Activities account (specifically the Long Range Standoff Cruise Missile Warhead Study) by \$7.6 million and apply the savings to the spending reduction account. Failed 181-239.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>

25	452	<p>H.Con.Res.105 (McGovern) 7/11/2014. Prohibits the President from deploying or maintaining U.S. Armed Forces in a sustained combat role in Iraq without specific statutory authorization enacted after the adoption of this concurrent resolution. Agreed to 370-40.</p> <p>Council position: support</p>
