Key Votes

- 1. Nuclear Weapons:** Tauscher (D-CA) amendment to the Defense Authorization bill to transfer \$21 million from the development of new nuclear weapons to conventional weapons programs. Amendment rejected 199-226, May 22, 2003. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 2. Iraq Intelligence:** Lee (D-CA) amendment to the Intelligence Authorization bill to require a study on how much intelligence the U.S. intelligence community shared with U.N. weapons inspectors in Iraq prior to the invasion. Amendment rejected 185-239, June 26, 2003. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 3. U.N. Dues:** Paul (R-TX) amendment to the State Department Authorization bill to cut the U.S. contribution to the United Nations. Rejected 74-350, July 15, 2003. A no vote supports the Council position.
- 4. U.N. Dues:** King (R-IA) amendment to the State Department Authorization bill to limit U.S. contributions to the United Nations. Rejected 187-237, July 15, 2003. A no vote supports the Council position.
- 5. Abu Ghraib:** Weldon (R-PA) amendment to the Defense Authorization bill to express the sense of Congress that the Defense Secretary should help the Iraqi government destroy the Abu Ghraib prison and replace it with a modern detention facility. Amendment adopted 308-114, May 20, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 6. Nuclear Weapons:** Tauscher (D-CA) amendment to the Defense Authorization bill to transfer \$36.6 million from the Energy Department's Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator "bunker-buster" and other projects to programs to improve conventional bunker-busting capabilities. Amendment rejected 204-214, May 20, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 7. Detainees:** Waxman (D-CA) motion to add to the Defense Authorization bill a sense of the House provision that a select committee should be established to investigate the treatment of detainees in the global war on terrorism, including allegations of abuse of Iraqi prisoners. Motion rejected 202-224, May 20, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 8. 9/11 Intelligence:** Kucinich (D-OH) amendment to the Intelligence Authorization bill to direct the CIA's inspector general to audit the evidence of the pre-9/11 connections between Saddam Hussein and al Qaeda. Amendment adopted 343-76, June 23, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 9. Detainees:** Reyes (D-TX) amendment to the Intelligence Authorization bill to withhold 25 percent of the funds until congressional committees receive all documents related to the handling and treatment of detainees in Iraq, Afghanistan, Guantanamo Bay and elsewhere. Amendment rejected 149-270, June 23, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 10. Non-proliferation:** Wilson (R-NM) amendment to the Energy and Water Appropriations bill to increase funding for nuclear non-proliferation programs by \$5 million. Amendment rejected 163-224, June 25, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
- 11. Nuclear Weapons:** Meehan (D-MA) amendment to the Energy and Water Appropriations bill to transfer \$30 million from nuclear weapons programs to the Global Threat Reduction initiative. Amendment rejected 151-235, June 25, 2004. A yes vote supports the Council position.
