Vote 1: U.N. funding: Biden (D-DE) amendment to lift the cap on U.S. contributions for U.N. peacekeeping. Amendment rejected 40 – 57, April 5, 2005. (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 2: John Bolton: Motion to invoke cloture and cut off debate on the nomination of John Bolton to be U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Motion failed 54 – 38, with 60 votes required, June 20, 2005. (A “no” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 3: Nuclear bunker buster: Feinstein (D-CA) amendment to bar spending on the nuclear bunker buster (Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator) program. Amendment rejected 43 – 53, July 1, 2005. (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 4: Non-proliferation programs: Lugar (R-IN) amendment to extend nuclear non-proliferation programs and eliminate bureaucratic obstacles. Amendment adopted 78 – 19, July 21, 2005. (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 5: Missile defense: Reed (D-RI) amendment to transfer \$50 million from missile defense to nuclear non-proliferation programs. Amendment rejected 37 – 60, November 8, 2005. (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 6: Detainee abuse: Levin (D-MI) amendment to create an independent commission to examine prisoner detainee abuse. Amendment rejected 43 – 55, November 8, 2005. (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 7: Iran: Santorum (R-PA) amendment to impose harsh, unilateral sanctions on Iran that could have undercut a Bush Administration diplomatic initiative. Amendment tabled or rejected 53 – 46, June 15, 2006. (in the next vote, a Biden (D-DE) amendment endorsing the Bush Administration’s diplomatic initiative with Iran was approved 99 – 0), (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 8: Iraq: Levin (D-MI) – Reed (D-RI) amendment urging the U.S. to begin the phased redeployment of American forces from Iraq in 2006. Amendment rejected 39 – 60, June 22, 2006 (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 9: Iraq: Kerry (D-MA), Feingold (D-WI) and Boxer (D-CA) amendment to mandate the completion of a troop withdrawal from Iraq by July 1, 2007. Amendment rejected 13 – 86, June 22, 2006 (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 10: Conventional warheads for Trident submarine: Sessions (R-AL) amendment to restore funds for building conventional warheads for the Trident nuclear submarine. Amendment rejected 31 – 67, August 3, 2006 (A “no” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 11: U.S.-India nuclear deal: Passage of the U.S.-India nuclear agreement. Deal approved 85 – 12, November 16, 2006 (A “no” vote supports the Council position)

Vote 12: U.S.-India nuclear deal: Bingaman (D-NM) amendment to require a Presidential determination that India has stopped producing fissile nuclear material and that the U.S. and India are taking steps to conclude a multilateral fissile material cut-off agreement. Amendment rejected 26 – 73, November 16, 2006 (A “yes” vote supports the Council position)
