## U.S. House of Representatives

### 110th Congress, Second Session\*

**1. Iraq: Amendment to provide \$162.6 billion in funding for the war in Iraq and Afghanistan** — (5/15/2008 – Roll Call No. 328) By 149 *nays* to 141 *yeas* the House rejected an amendment that would have provided funding for the war well into 2009. 132 Republicans protested the procedures for considering the bill by voting “present.” (A “no” vote supports the Council position.)

**2. Iraq: Amendment to place limits on the President’s ability to wage war** — (5/15/2008 – Roll Call No. 329) By a vote of 227 *yeas* to 196 *nays* the House approved an amendment specifying a number of war-related provisions, including the deadline for withdrawal of U.S. troops from Iraq by 12/31/2009, a ban on permanent military bases in Iraq, a ban on torture, a limit on the length of U.S. troop deployments and prohibitions banning war profiteering. (A “yea” vote supports the Council position.)

**3. Missile Defense: Amendment to allocate \$719 million for missile defense programs** — (5/22/2008 – Roll Call No. 356) By a vote of 229 *nays* to 186 *yeas* the House rejected a Trent Franks (R-AZ) amendment to increase funding to the Theater High-Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) system, the Aegis Ballistic Missile Defense system and the Missile Defense Agency’s Tests & Targets portfolio. (A “no” vote supports the Council position.)

**4. New Nuclear Weapons: Amendment to allocate \$10 million for the Reliable Replacement Warhead** — (5/22/2008 – Roll Call No. 358) By a vote of 271 *nays* to 145 *yeas* the House rejected an amendment that would have transferred money from energy conservation programs to new nuclear weapons research. (A “no” vote supports the Council position.)

**5. Iraq: Amendment to put limits on long-term agreements with Iraq** — (5/22/2008 – Roll Call No. 359) By a vote of 234 *yeas* to 183 *nays* the House passed an amendment prohibiting the President from entering into any agreement obligating the U.S. to the defense of Iraq from any internal or external threats without the advice and consent of the Senate. (A “yea” vote supports the Council position.)

**6. Missile Defense: Amendment to reduce funding for the Missile Defense Agency by \$966.2 million** — (5/22/2008 – Roll Call No. 357) By a vote of 292 *nays* to 122 *yeas* the House rejected a John Tierney (D-MA) amendment that would have transferred money from missile defense programs to non-proliferation programs and programs supporting service members returning from overseas deployments. (A “yea” vote supports the Council position.)

**7. Iraq: Amendment to provide \$161.8 billion in funding for the Iraq war with no deadline for the withdrawal of U.S. troops** — (06/19/2008 – Roll Call No. 431) By 268 *yeas* to 155 *nays*, the House voted to continue funding for the Iraq war. (A “no” vote supports the Council position.)

**8. U.S.-India Nuclear Deal: Vote on approving the U.S.-India Nuclear Deal** — (9/27/2008 – Roll Call No. 662) By a vote of 298 *yeas* to 117 *nays* the House approved legislation authorizing nuclear trade and cooperation with India. (A “no” vote supports the Council position.)
